2015 Highlights & Accomplishments



EDUCATION: Mederi Offers Custom-Designed Course for ETMS Alumni

In the Fall of 2015, Mederi offered, for the first time, a new course designed especially for ETMS alumni, titled "Clinical Applications in Integrative Cancer Therapies". For the past eleven years, Mederi has offered one Fundamentals and one Advanced level training in the ETMS annually. After hearing from many students requesting further training beyond their participation in the ongoing monthly Round Table Discussion Group and ETMS network, this additional advanced training was designed. This new opportunity focused on case studies, which allowed participants to refine and deepen their understanding of the ETMS as it applies in cancer therapies, specifically complex



case management. There was also focus on integrating conventional medicine with botanical and nutritional therapies to manage side effects and improve outcomes in specific clinical situations. We were thrilled to have twenty-five students participate and due to its popularity, we have plans to offer this course again in 2018. One of the students from the course had this to share: "Mederi has created a fabulous support network for me and for any practitioner willing to invest the time to learn... one that offers hope, life, and a great deal of love to a population of patients that has largely been abandoned by mainstream medicine."

RESEARCH: Clinical Trials Moving Forward with Prestigious Academic Center

In August of 2015, our hope to influence and see the use of botanical and nutritional medicine in conventional settings became more real. Five years after our initial discussions about an ETMS research study with The Ohio State University's James Cancer Center (JCC), we received exciting news that our protocol for a "Pilot Study of Individualized Integrative Intervention in Metastatic Breast Cancer" was approved by the Clinical Scientific Review Committee. This news came alongside the announcement that the Ohio State University's JCC was once again awarded the highest merit descriptor of "EXCEPTIONAL" by the National Cancer Institute (NCI), with a numeric score of a perfect 10, to continue its standing as an NCI-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center. NCI-designated Cancer Centers are characterized by scientific excellence and the capability to integrate a diversity of research approaches to focus on the problem of cancer. We could not be more proud and grateful for the opportunity to be working with such a prestigious academic center!



The process of designing a study of this kind is no small feat, especially when it comes to the practical and logistical details of study management and a pharmacy's role in dispensing numerous supplements. Due to the complexity of the study, it was essential to provide the committee with a tremendous amount of safety data on all the herbs to be included in the study.

Over the next year or more, we'll undertake the final part of the process which will be to receive IRB approval and to work with a team of research coordinators to manage patient recruitment, education, data collection, and coordinating logistics between departments. In the end, our goal is to demonstrate significant improvement in quality of life, drug treatment tolerability, and symptom management.

We look forward to sharing more news about this opportunity as we progress with implementation of the trial.




A Patient's Story of Faith, Perseverance and Love





Case Statement

CANCER: A NEW STRATEGY IS NEEDED

In 2015, more than 1.6 million Americans are expected to be diagnosed with cancer. Despite medical advances, conventional treatment for most cancers – surgery, chemotherapy, and radiation – has barely changed in 40 years. Patients often suffer debilitating symptoms, and even "breakthrough" drugs are only extending lives by a few months. Helping people battle and survive cancer therefore requires a truly integrative model that treats each patient as a unique individual and strengthens their health in a wholistic and harmonious way.

ECLECTIC TRIPHASIC MEDICAL SYSTEM (ETMS)

The Mederi Foundation's Eclectic Triphasic Medical System (ETMS) merges ancient, wholistic medicine with modern, allopathic medicine. Specially trained ETMS practitioners at the Mederi Centre for Natural Healing in Ashland, OR provide expert guidance to patients and deliver personalized botanical, nutritional, lifestyle, dietary, and naturopathic medicine protocols. ETMS can help patients thrive in spite of cancer, and has yielded astounding results, both on its own and in tandem with conventional cancer treatments.

THE MEDERI FOUNDATION

The Mederi Foundation is a nonprofit organization dedicated to optimizing cancer treatment and outcomes, and improving quality of life for those facing chronic diseases. Mederi has trained oncologists and other MDs, naturopaths, acupuncturists, herbalists, nurse practitioners, RNs, and chiropractors. Students have come to us from the United States, Canada, Scotland, Switzerland, France, Russia and Israel. In 2013, the ETMS Clinical Training Program was delivered to 150 practitioners at Beilinson Hospital in Tel Aviv, Israel.

THE FUTURE: HOW YOU CAN HELP

To help achieve our vision of advancing personalized, integrative cancer care to the next level, we are launching the Mederi Medicine Future Fund Campaign, with a goal of raising \$350,000 annually over the next three years. These funds will enable us to expand four core areas:

- 1. Patient Scholarships Economic status should not determine who receives care and who does not. That's why the Mederi Foundation provides scholarships to patients in need.
- 2. Online Education Training Program Online delivery of our training program allows us to reach more healthcare providers and, therefore, more patients.
- Clinical Trials & Case Study Research Crucial to helping mainstream Mederi's innovative approach. We have already raised \$50,000 towards funding our first clinical trial with Ohio State University's James Cancer Center, investigating the effectiveness of ETMS in conjunction with conventional medical therapies for treating metastatic breast cancer.
 - 4. **Hiring an Executive Director** Maintaining growth and progress requires that we hire a salaried Executive Director to ensure Mederi's long-term, sustainable future.
